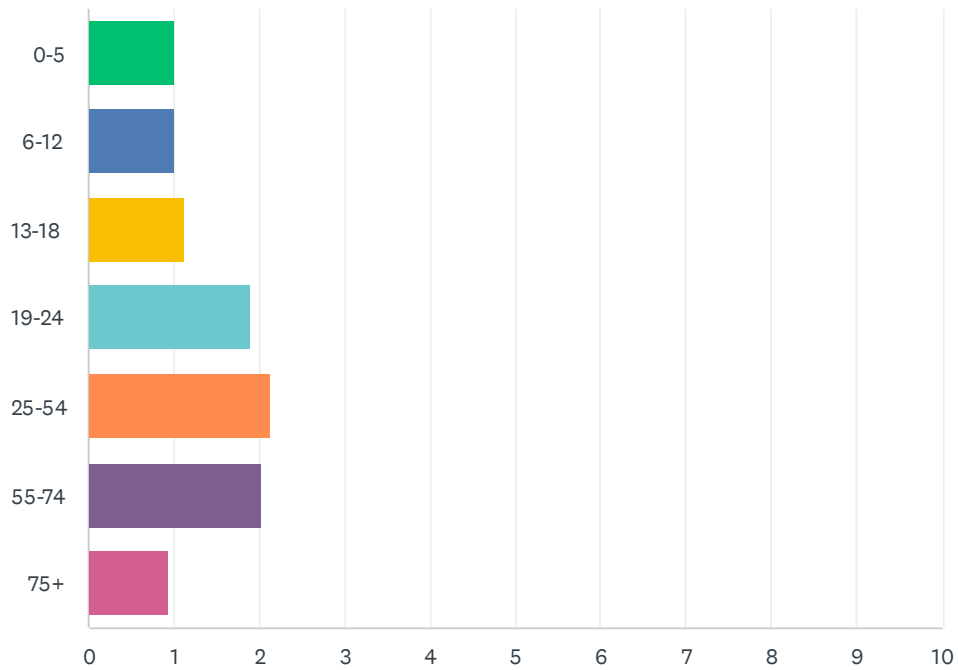

Q. 10 – Additional Comments/Ideas – Open-ended answers

(Note: contact information has been removed)

I hope that you modify the "Lake It Slow" campaign this summer, and stop referring to it as a "blitz" - who really wants to be blitzed by signage or anything else. One sign per property would eliminate what to me were several annoying and redundant clusters of signs last summer; the three-foot setback from the State roads should also be emphasized. Last summer East Shore Road had about half a dozen signs that did not follow this State regulation; some of them were actually placed in the guard wires or on an embankment where they leaned into the shoulder area. Someone from the board should monitor this. I am all for traffic safety and the police patrol, and I didn't notice a significantly increased police presence last summer, and I think there should be. I hope that after one more summer of so much additional signage that you will consider placing the Lake It Slow signs only at select key points around the Lake. I'm disturbed at having to look at a plethora of yellow signs on our Scenic Roads in perpetuity, and also concerned that another group may get the idea that these roads could become a platform for advertising their cause.

The current LWA Leadership has done a much better job than in past years.

It would be nice to see some recognition of the Native people who once lived around the lake. Perhaps a joint project with the Institute for American Indian Studies?

I don't think managing geese population is under the purview of the LWA. The LWA website cites concerns of E. coli bacteria and nitrogen from geese feces; if that is a concern for the health and safety of the lake, it should be addressed by the Lake Waramaug Task Force.

I think the "Lake it Slow" campaign has been successful in reducing speeds around the lake. I do not want the quiet Lake Waramaug community to be overrun with Police officers trying to get people for speeding tickets - I think it would negatively effect the atmosphere of the community.

Cell phone coverage around the lake would be nice but not a priority. Extra consideration must be given as to where the additional cell phone tower(s) would be built - I don't think anyone would want it visible from anywhere around the lake.

An additional rule/enforcement that I think might be good regarding watercrafts on the lake is banning/regulating use of jetskis.

One idea that I think would be fun is creating more social events for teens/young adults. Especially at night!

Just a note: we are starting to have a problem with AirBNB and similar rental organizations on the lake. there are a few people who have turned their houses into short stay hotels and are disturbing the nearby residents. So far, Zoning has been unresponsive. This is a problem that could easily wreck havoc on life at the lake. It is a potentially explosive issue. I think the Association should tread carefully but support the current single family housing zoning that prohibits short term rental activity.

Hard to answer a lot of the questions above re additional enforcement without a better baseline - I do not perceive a problem with speeding boats or cars, and I don't know what the ridgeline laws look like - I am for 'reasonable' regulation and opposed to nanny state governance - so it is all in how things are enacted and enforced...

<p>The LWTF needs to better coordinate with the DEEP to ensure that we get resources to help improve the lake. In particular, it would be great to establish a partnership with the DEEP that gives the LWTF some control to implement best lake health practices at the state park. As it is now, the park harms the lake by contradicting the DEEP's own recommendations for lake health by removing vegetation and boulders along the shore and from drainage ditches (one is very large). The state park appears to be run with no oversight whatsoever. Handing at least environmental oversight to the LWTF would cost the DEEP nothing and could dramatically improve lake clarity to the benefit of everyone especially park users.</p>

I think a time restriction is the only fair way to take any steps in the right direction. I would love to ban wakesurfing completely, but doubt we as an association can pull that off. A time restriction feels like the most fair middle ground.</p>
<p>I believe strongly that we have the rules and regulations we need for safe enjoyment of both the lake and the surrounding roads. We could benefit from greater respect for and enforcement of what exists today, but additional regulations will likely diminish enjoyment and utility of the lake and therefore the attractiveness of the lake as a recreational resource and destination.</p>
